BLUE STAR BANNER

Memoria The Blue Star Banner is displayed on

✓ the banner stand today. Blue Star Banners have historically been made to

honor individuals serving our country in military service. The blue stars represent individuals in active service. The gold stars represent individuals who were killed during military service. The 99 stars on this banner are believed to represent members of St. Paul's Lutheran Church and family members of congregational members who served in World War II, the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam War.

The three gold stars represent **Sgt. Arthur Louis Sonneborn**, U.S. Army Air Forces, SP4 Dennis Edward Brown, and William Walding. Sgt. Sonneborn and SP4 Brown were baptized and confirmed at St. Paul's. Sgt. Sonneborn was killed on July 21, 1944, when his plane went down between Iceland and Greenland. His name is recorded at the Tablets of the Missing at Cambridge American Cemetery in Cambridge, England. SP4 Brown was killed on June 11, 1966, in South Vietnam during active combat. He was awarded the Purple Heart, Bronze Star and Good Conduct Medal. SP4 Brown is the son of the late Norman and the late Darlene Brown. He is survived by sisters, Sandra (Brown) Andersen, Sharon (Brown) Taylor, and a brother, Tom Brown.
