# Pastor's Page Are You Adopted?



July of 2020 was a monumental month for the Hsu family. On July 13, in front of a judge, Andrea and I made our promise together to officially take upon the parental responsibility to four precious children: Christian, Natalie, Andrew and Nevaeh.

Since they moved into our home last May, once in while they would ask us, "Are we going to be adopted?" With smiles on our faces, we responded, "Yes, we would love to!"

After knowing the adoption paperwork was in progress, their question was changed to "When will we be adopted?"

After the adoption court hearing date was set, they started the countdown. "Are we going to be adopted in 7 days?", "Are we going to be adopted in 5 days?", "Are we going to be adopted in 2 days?" and finally, "Are we going to be adopted today?"

After July 13, Christian, now my oldest son, came to me and said, "Do you know you are my dad?" With a smile on my face, I responded, "Really?! I need time to think about it. But do you know you are my son?"

Do I know I am a father to four precious children? Yes, of course I do. But there are still times during the middle of night I need to remind myself that I am now a father. Having the role of a parent is still so surreal to me.

As I look at the picture of my new family, I am reminded one very important thing: I was once adopted, too!

Six days after the adoption, July 19, it was another monumental day for the Hsu family. Our four children were adopted for the second time in a week.

As a pastor and a father, I had the privilege and joy to pour water on them in the name of our Triune God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Through Holy Baptism, they were welcomed into the family of Christ.

During the past year, they had asked me many times when they could be baptized. Yes, I would love to get them baptized right away. However, because of some legal concerns, I had to tell them, "as soon as you are adopted, we will get you baptized right away!"

Therefore, soon after the earthly adoption was finalized and we officially were given the parental responsibility to our children, we brought them to the Lord. They were baptized and received the promise in baptism – the forgiveness of sin. They are now not only children of mine but also children of God.

Do I know I am a father to my four precious children? Yes, I do. Do I know God the Father is my Heavenly Father? Yes, I do. But I need to be reminded. When I poured water on them, it reminded me of my own baptism. On that day, my parents took me to the Lord's house, and I was adopted into the family of God.

Do you know you are adopted too? Do you know God the Father is your Heavenly Father? Remember St. Paul said to us in Ephesians 1:3–6:

*"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love he predestined us for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed us in the Beloved."*

St. Paul's is state and nationally accredited. We care about the health and safety of our students, families, and staff foremost. We will do our best to follow public health, CDC, and Iowa Department of Education guidelines when possible.

#### OUR RETURN-TO-LEARN PLAN FOR 2020-2021:

To limit the number of people in the building, parents are to bring their children to the east gym door and check students into Extended Care (Extended Care starts at 7:25 AM) or drop them off at the front buzz-in door after 8:30AM. If you need to pick up your child early, we ask that you come to the front door, buzz in, and wait for your child to be brought to you.

Consistent with IDPH guidance and school policies, staff or students who are ill should stay home. Parents are asked to take their child's temperature before school. If a child shows symptoms and has a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher, please keep your child home. If a child shows more than one symptom and has a temperature of 100.4 or higher, he/she will be sent home. The staff will follow the same guidelines.

All classrooms sizes will be limited, so distancing can be implemented. Groups will be limited to one or two classes.

The lunchroom and gym will be used for serving lunch, so only 10-12 will be served at a time. The tables will be sanitized between groups. Please, send a water bottle each day, as we will try to avoid access drinking fountain use.

Requiring face coverings for all staff and students is not recommended. SPLS will allow the personal use of cloth face coverings by staff and students. SPLS will provide the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE). Masks, gloves, and hand sanitizer will be available by each room.

SPLS will teach and reinforce washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds following CDC guidance. If soap and water are not readily available, SPLS will teach and reinforce use of a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol using CDC guidance.

#### STUDENT GATHERINGS:

Schools may not be able to guarantee that physical distancing can be met in all school settings throughout the entire school day, or during school activities. This is similar to when children congregate in their community. It is important SPLS implement preventative health changes that can be sustainable and done with fidelity.

Upcoming Packaging Events for August 2020 has been cancelled.

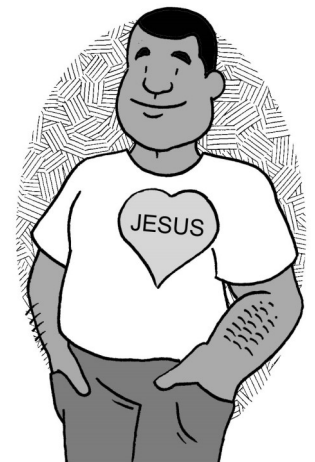

# Notes from our Missionaries

**Siouxland Hispanic Ministry:** A couple things to note: In last month's newsletter, I mentioned that I was approached by an organization called "Community Response" and asked to be the primary contact person for all Spanish speakers in our area seeking aid. After receiving about 3 calls every day for weeks, we have been able to connect many families with financial aid, food, and other community organizations offering help. As I help them fill out the applications over the phone, I have the opportunity to introduce myself and our "Iglesia Luterana Esperanza" (Hope Lutheran Church). In addition to the physical needs, many ask me to pray for them. Some ask for a visit to their homes. I have started a new weekly study with Juana and her son, Cristofer, from El Salvador as a result these connections. Just yesterday, Growing Community Connections (a tristate effort to foster collaboration between all sorts of local organizations and non-profits) asked me to be a member of their board of directors.
