Love Our Neighbors as Ourselves

Maybe it was a long, long, time ago, but many of you probably still remember that, in your confirmation class, your teacher taught you that the Ten Commandments could be divided into two tables: 1-3, which talk about the relationship between God and us; and 4-10, talk about others and us.

Also, "love" is the word that summarizes all the Commandments. However, how do we apply all this in our daily lives?

One time, a lawyer asked Jesus a question to test Him. "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" And He said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:35–39)

So, to follow the first table, we pray to God, have daily devotions, come to church for worship, and join Bible studies. But how about the second table: love our neighbor as ourselves? How do we do that not just in words?

We are to care for the spiritual and physical needs of the people around us.

For their spiritual needs, we need to tell them about Jesus. His love and death on the cross for us, so that whoever believes in Him, their sins are forgiven, and they can have the gift of eternal life.

For their physical needs, we are to use the resources God has put under our trust – time, talents and treasures, to share our love. Jesus at many places taught His hearers that love and actions go side by side. Remember in the parable of the Good Samaritan, we are taught to care for those in need. In teaching about the Final judgement, Jesus said, "When we show our love to one of the least of those brothers in need, we do it to Him."

As a family of Christ here at St. Paul's, we want to love our neighbor as ourselves. However, the biggest challenge for us today is, with so many scams and frauds going around in our society, which channel or means shall we use to show our love to our neighbors.

At one of the Evangelism Committee weekly meetings, the members talked about all the opportunities we have at St. Paul's to reach out to our communities in 2019. We are glad to see that more than one group at St. Paul's are showing their love for our neighbors in action. They deserve our promotions and recognitions. M&M Valentine's Day Cookie Bar

Ingredients

2 sticks of butter at room temperature

1 cup of granulated sugar

1 cup of firmly packed brown sugar

3 eggs

1 1/2 tsps. of vanilla extract

3 cups of all purpose flour

³⁄₄ tsp. of baking soda

³⁄₄ tsp. of salt

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups of valentine's M&M's

1 cup of mini chocolate chip

Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a 9x13-inch baking dish with foil, leave some overhang to make removal easier. Spray foil generously with non-stick cooking spray.

In a bowl, mix together butter, sugar, and brown sugar, until fluffy. Mix in eggs and vanilla. Add flour, baking soda, and salt and mix until smooth. Add M&M's and mini chocolate chips and give a final stir, reserving some M&M's and chocolate chips for topping cookie bars.

Put mixture into prepared baking dish; press additional M&M's and chocolate chips into top of cookie dough. Bake 35 to 40 minutes on lower rack of oven to prevent browning.

Let cool completely, cut and enjoy!!
