Pastor's Page

This month we celebrate the Independence Day of our country. Independence means to have the freedom from the control, influence, support, aid, or the like, of others. On July 4th, we remember the Declaration of Independence of the United States back in 1776. "The Continental Congress declared that the thirteen American colonies were no longer subject to the monarch of Britain and were now united, free, and independent states."



Now, 243 years later, we thank God that we still have the freedom that our forefathers had fought for – freedom of religion, freedom of speech, freedom of the press, the right to keep and bear arms, etc...

However, "with great power comes great responsibility."

So, we should be asking ourselves as we enjoy the freedom that we have. Are we using those freedoms in the right way, or are we abusing them? In other words, are we using the freedom to worship the true God, or are we worshiping idols, false gods or even ourselves? Are we speaking our words to build others up, or are we hurting others with gossip and unkind words? Are we using the press to tell the truth, or are we using them for personal gains and evil plots? Are we bearing arms to protect the weak, or are we using them for murders?

Freedom is a very precious but also very dangerous thing. Exercising it right can be great, but misusing it can be deadly. Think about Adam and Eve. When God created them, He gave them the freewill. When they exercised the freewill in the right way, they had perfect relationship with God, each other and the world. Everything was in perfect harmony. However, when they yielded to the temptation from Satan, sin entered this world and the results was detrimental and deadly.

Thanks be to God that He knew, that left to our own, we would be lost and dead forever. So, He sent His Son Jesus Christ into this world to die for us on the cross, so that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life. By the blood of Jesus, we are clean and free again.

Jesus says in John 8:36: *"If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."* So, what do we do with the freedom that Jesus Christ has won for us?

Many people in our country like the freedom but they don't know how to exercise the freedom in the right way. Similarly, many Christians enjoy that Jesus Christ has set us free but don't know how to exercise it in the right way either.

Apostle Paul teaches us how to exercise our freedom in Christ in the right way. Romans 6:6–11: "We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus."

Freedom in Christ doesn't mean that we can do anything we want and don't have to be responsible for the consequences. No! It means sin no longer has power over us, and we are free to follow God and His will again.

So, today, let us give thanks to God for the freedom that we have to worship Him, and let us give thanks to God for the freedom in Christ to follow Him. Amen.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL 2019

Vacation Bible School was a great week of learning about how Jesus Rescues. The children worshiped by singing upbeat action songs such as "Never Let Go Of Me," "Won't Worry 'Bout A Thing," and "Million Reasons."

The children watched a daily video of real kids who have experienced Jesus' rescue in their lives. They discussed real life topics like feeling alone, overcoming worry, and trusting Jesus for rescue in many of life's hard times.

Daily lessons were — When you're alone ... Jesus rescues. When you worry ... Jesus rescues. When you do wrong ... Jesus rescues. When you're powerless ... Jesus rescues.

Every day we added a sticker patch to a hole in our sail. Each sticker was a God Sighting the kids talked about. God Sightings are seeing things that God has created, allowed, provided, done, or revealed to us. At the end of the week our sail was completed and when turned around, the cross revealed that God was always with us.

Around 50 boys and girls attended this event. A huge "thank you" to everyone who volunteered their time to make this a success. The kids donated 160 pounds of pennies for Camp High Hopes in Sioux City.

STEWARDSHIP DEVOTION

Scripture Reading:

"Increase our faith" (Luke 17:1-10).

Love through Faith

What is it that precedes the disciples' request of Jesus to increase their faith? It is Jesus command to count others so precious as to avoid putting any kind of temptation in their paths. It is His command to love others so dearly that they would forgive without limit.

How is this possible? If we are honest with ourselves, we must admit that, in and of ourselves, we cannot follow these commands. Then we, like the disciples, must ask of our Lord, *"Increase our faith."*

How does Jesus respond to their request? He assures them that even faith as small as a mustard seed can accomplish great things. It is God Who gives the faith, and it is God Who gives us the ability to act on it. It is God Who gives us the love through faith that sacrifices our own desires for the good of others, love through faith that knows no limit, love through faith that serves instead of asking to be served.

It is faith that gives us such love for God and our neighbor that we serve and help and give without thought of reward, so that we *"when [we] have done everything [we] were told to do, should say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty'"* (Luke 17:10).

Dear Heavenly Father, certainly, in order to measure up to Your standards, we must ask You to increase our faith. Still we fail, for we do not love You with our entire beings, nor do we love our neighbors as ourselves. Therefore, we thank You for the gift of Your Son Who has met Your standard of perfection and has lived that standard in our places. Forgive us, Lord, for our failures. Teach us to depend on You to give us grace to be obedient to Your command to love others even as You love us. Through Christ we pray. Amen.

Dear Friends,

Greetings once again, we hope this finds you enjoying the days of summer. We know many of you are having a lot of rain -- too much of it in fact. We are wishing we could share in some of that rain as we are in drought conditions and are likely not to get rain until November or December.

We are continuing to plug along. Work is going very slowly and we are really seeing a lot of spiritual warfare. We realize spiritual warfare is not really recognized in our modern society, and most of us don't think about it much. However, evil spirits do exist, and the things our translators (and us, to some extent) are experiencing are real and are affecting their work. We ask that you would continue to keep Splash, Moses, and Moronga in your prayers.

Otherwise, we are getting ready to have some of the people from the Bible Society of Botswana (BSB) come and visit our area next week. The purpose of the visit is for the BSB people to meet with Khwe community leaders and to mobilize support in the community for our Bible translation program. This was actually to have been done years ago, but we are so remote and there were some changes and happenings within the BSB which just kept it from happening. We are happy they are going to visit our area now. Hopefully it will be a very positive thing for the Khwe.

Tim is also continuing to write his thesis for his doctorate program. He has just finished his fourth chapter and it has been approved. He now has to write his last chapter. Hopefully he will be able to do that and have it approved before our furlough; then he should be able to defend his thesis while we are on furlough and hopefully receive his doctorate next Spring. Any prayers on Tim's behalf are appreciated.

- Thanksgiving that Tim has only one more chapter to write on his thesis.
- Thanksgiving for Splash, Moses and Moronga.
