Pastor's Page

On the church calendar we are now in the season of Pentecost.

In the book of Acts, we learned that, on the Day of Pentecost, the disciples of Jesus "were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance." Many people in Jerusalem that day heard the Gospel and were saved. What an exciting experience for the disciples to know that God was with them, and He continued to work through them to fulfill His master plan of salvation.

But what happened to the disciples after that? Did their life go back to "normal" again?

Since the outbreak of Coronavirus, whether we like it or not, we all have to change the ways we do things. Wearing masks and keeping social distancing are the new social requirements. Learning how to use Zoom has become the new trend because people use it to do meetings and learnings. To stay open, many stores and restaurants have to provide curbside pickup service. We do not know if the virus will ever go away, and this means we might have to adopt the changes as the new normal.

Changes are not always easy, and they can be challenging because we are creatures of habit. We like to do things our ways. However, God is in changing business. He provides new normal for His children. Apostle Paul says in 2 Corinthians 5:17, "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come."

When we are saved, we have a new identity – a child of God. We no longer belong to this world, but God. The Holy Spirit now lives in us. He directs and empowers us to lead a godly life. In other words, we have a new normal to follow.

In Ephesians 4:22–24 Saint Paul further encourages us to put off our old self, which belongs to our former manner of life and is corrupt through deceitful desires, and to be renewed in the spirit of our minds, and to put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness.

No doubt about it, our new normal is very different from our old one. As long as we still live in this broken world, our old self does not like all the changes God has for us. We need to be taught and to learn how to adopt the new normal. That is what the teachings of Pentecost Season about: With the help of the Holy Spirit to live a new life.

The life of the disciples of Jesus did not go back to their old ways after that first Pentecost following Easter. In fact, the Pentecost experience marked the beginning of their exciting journey with God.

So is our life in Christ. Daily we see the Holy Spirit guiding us to live the new normal we have in Christ.

As we begin the Pentecost season, let us pray that God would give us a humble heart and a teachable mind that we could grow our faith daily in Him. Amen.

Notes from our Missionaries

SIOUXLAND HISPANIC MINISTRY

These are truly times that challenge! Do we tend to think that having faith in God means exemption from suffering? Or that really believing is all that's needed to have our best life now? No. Faith does not exempt us and suffering does not discriminate along political, religious, or racial lines. Prayers

aren't always answered how we'd like. Dreams can vanish in a moment and "your best life now" becomes an empty phrase only highlighting the pain and loss. As Christians, we find ourselves on our knees praying like our Lord in Gethsemane, "My Father, if it be possible, let this cup pass from me [from my family, from my community, from my nation]; nevertheless, not as I will, but as you will" (Matt. 26:39). We are reminded that His ways are not our ways. Faith takes on a deeper, perhaps more painful, character. It means letting go. It means we are not in control. As we are being challenged—physically, mentally, and spiritually— may our Lord grant us His peace which surpasses all understanding! Here are few updates of what is happening in the Hispanic Ministry in Siouxland:

- 1. We've formed a WhatsApp group (a messaging service very popular throughout most of the world). We now have nearly 30 people in our group receiving daily audio and video devotions from Pastor Henry and me. We've never met most members of the group in person, so it's been a good way to pave the way for new connections and relationships.
- 2. I've been asked by a community leader to be the primary contact person for all Spanish speakers in our county who call our "211" Nebraska hotline looking for social services. I pray this will lead to many new connections and an increased reputation as "the church who speaks our language and is here to serve."
- 3. Typically, we've had our Spanish services on Sunday evenings. With the goal of helping our Anglo and Hispanic members feel more united, we'll be having our English and Spanish services at the same time (Sundays at 9:30 am). This will allow our Hispanic kids to go to Sunday school with their peers, the adults to share some coffee and donuts, and it will also open opportunities for bilingual services on special occasions.

GREETINGS FROM BOTSWANA.

With the pandemic going on and being in lock-down, nothing has really been happening here to report on. We are very grateful that Tim got us fairly well stocked up before everything closed, so we have been doing well. Some essential services have been open, and there has been opportunity to order food from some warehouses. Botswana is starting to open up a little more (only six active cases of the virus right now), though rules could be tightened again if the number of people getting sick spikes. We still need to request permits to leave our house which are shown at all police check points. Hopefully these restrictions will be further loosened in the near future.

Work-wise we aren't sure what the translators are up to. They were supposed to upload their completed work every Friday, but is not getting done. We are thinking this is due to technical problems; communication has been very difficult with them. We are praying that work is still actually being done, that it's just a case of not being able to upload it to where Tim can see it. Otherwise the pandemic really hasn't affected our family too much, homeschooling is still happening whether the boys want to do it or not.

Thank you again for all of your prayers on our behalf.
