Pastor's Page

A few weeks ago, I took a 13-year-old boy to a meeting. It was a dark and raining evening, hard for me to see the entrance to the parking lot. As a result, I drove into the parking lot from the exit.

"Oops!" I said to myself. Since it was too late and too dangerous to back up, I kept driving, hoping no one would come out at that time. Suddenly, this 13-year-old boy asked me, "Pastor, is that a sin?"



"What? What are you talking about? It was just an honest mistake. It was dark and raining. Anyone could easily make the same mistake. Plus, I'm turning my car around to face the right direction!"

I've become defensive, if you haven't noticed. I tried to justify my action – even when it was clearly my fault. But, did I sin? What is sin?

My dictionary says sin is "a transgression of divine law", and "any act regarded as such a transgression, especially a willful or deliberate violation of some religious or moral principle."

Since I didn't willfully or deliberately enter that parking lot the wrong way, you can't say that I have sinned! Well, can you say to the police officer who is writing a speeding ticket:

"What speed limit? I didn't see the speed limit sign at all? Plus, everyone else was driving faster than I! How come you are not stopping them?"

A friend of mine once got a speeding ticket on a highway by 15 miles over. He thought the highway patrol was very unreasonable because he was only 5 miles over. For him, if the speed limit is 65, from 65 to 75 should be the buffer. Therefore, since he was driving at the speed of 80, he was only 5 miles over. The highway patrol shouldn't have stopped him. Was he speeding? Of course, he was.

Another friend of mine got a speeding ticket in the downtown area by 2 miles over the speed limit – 25. When the police stopped her, she exclaimed, "You must be kidding me."

I'm sure you would agree with me that it was so unreasonable for the police officer to give her a ticket. But was she speeding?

The fact is, whether I like it or not, whether I did it on purpose or not, whether other people care or not, whether it was a serious issue or not, I did enter the parking lot the wrong way. But was that a sin?

What is sin? Sin is missing the mark. It has nothing to do with whether we do it on purpose or not. God's standard for us is that we must be holy. Without missing any marks. Can we do it?

We all have sinned! Some of the sin we are aware of. Some we aren't. Some have caused problems to others, some haven't. Some we did on purpose, some were honest mistakes.

In the Book of Romans Chapter 3, St. Paul says to us,

"For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

That's right, we are all sinners, and the wages of sin is death. Thank God that He is not only a holy, righteous and just God but also a God of love "who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth." (1 Timothy 2:4)

That's why He sent His Son Jesus to die for us.

Yes, we "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God", but believing in Jesus, we "are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus." (Roman 8:24)

So, next time when I see that boy again, I will tell him, "Yes, I did enter the parking lot the wrong way. It was an honest mistake, but it doesn't make it okay. There are times in life we do wrong things we don't intend to do, and we need to confess our sins to God and ask for forgiveness. And He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

LWML Rally Sunday is Oct. 6th. Marlene will take care of the bulletins and flowers. Quilts will be put on the pews.


We sang "Just As I Am Without One Plea" and "I Am Trusting Thee Lord Jesus".
