

# **Pastor's Page**

As the Election Day is fast approaching, every day we are bombarded with many campaign advertisements. However, as I watch those commercials, I have many concerns.



First of all, I wonder how much it costs to win a seat in Congress?

This is an old piece of information I found on www.msnbc.com:

"According to Maplight, a non-profit, non-partisan research organization that tracks money in politics, House candidates who won in 2012 raked in an average of \$1,689,580 in campaign contributions."

Those numbers climb substantially if you're running for Senate. Candidates who won a seat in Congress' upper chamber each raised an average of \$10,476,451."

And these amounts of money only increase, not decrease, every year.

Second, how do those candidates utilize so much money they have raised to run the campaign?

Do they use their money to tell people what they have done and what they will do?

As we watch those commercials, we see many of them are running negative campaigns. They attack their opponents by calling them either liars and have become corrupt. None of us have the ability to verify if any of those accusations are real or false.

I am not sure about you, but I am really sick and tired of watching those commercials. Those candidates are trying to win the elections not by showing their good qualities and promoting good policies, but by putting their opponents down.

Sadly, that is how this world functions when it comes to politics. As a result, we have an even more divided society than ever.

Is that what we, as Christians, will do if running for any political offices?

In the Eighth Commandment God tells us that "You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor." Luther explains this in his Small Catechism:

We should fear and love God so that we do not tell lies about our neighbor, betray him, slander him, or hurt his reputation, but defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way.

Yes, you and I may not be running for an office, but in our lives, we do from time to time using negative campaign concept to talk about other people. What is that? That is called "Gossip."

When we have conversation with other people, we like to talk about some of the bad things others have done. Some might be true; some you have heard from others and you don't know if they are true or not. As a result, we act like the rest of the world. Instead of building each other up, we tear each other down. We make ourselves feel good by stepping over others.

Sadly, that is happening a lot in the family of God.

Therefore, let us contemplate on the Word of God in Ephesians 4:29–32

"Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you." (ESV)




